CCA students had the opportunity to visit and learn about a variety of panamanian landmarks, institutions, and organizations.

Middle School Social Studies teacher Caleb Pahl took the 6th grade to the Panama Maritime Authority and learned about how and why ships are registered and "Flagged," as well as about the different types of boats that go through the canal. On May 3rd, Mr. Pahl took 7th & 8th grade students to visit the ruins of Panama Viejo to learn about the history of Panama.
